These customers are being short changed and denied their investment incomes that should have accrued to them had their pension deductions been remitted as at when due."

Workers Seek Higher Wages, Regular Pension this Year

he Organized Labour Unions in the country are demanding a new minimum wage as well as regular payment of pensions for workers in the New Year among other issues.

The President, NLC, Ayuba Wabba, in a New Year would commence this year. message stated that only eight states out of 36 states had started remitting contributions as of April, 2015.
